Part 1. Interview

Task A. Greetings & Introduction

Part 2. Role-Play

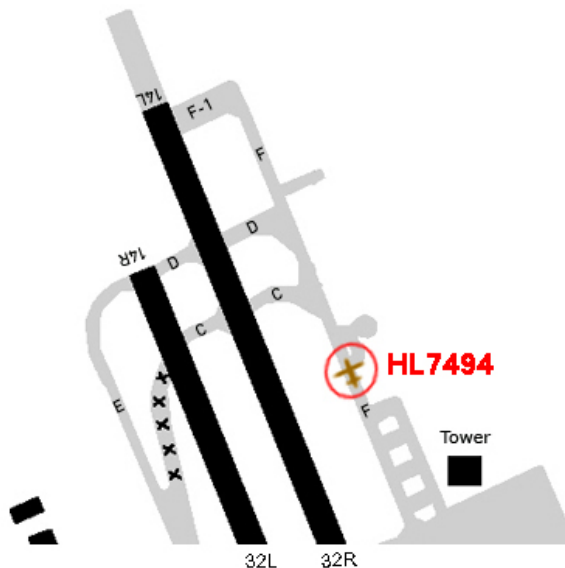
Note: The test taker's callsign for all three sections is Hotel Lima seven four niner four. The interviewer should tell the test taker his/her callsign prior to starting.

Task A. Situation 1

Imagine there is an altitude restriction of seven thousand feet at the next waypoint. The controller will be contacting you soon with a climb instruction that exceeds the altitude restriction. Respond to the controller's message, keeping the information above in mind.

Task B. Situation 2 (Picture)

Look at the picture provided. You have 15 seconds to study the picture.



You are taxiing to runway one four left in preparation for departure. You are light on weight and an intersection departure from Delta can expedite your departure. Listen to the controller's message, then request an intersection departure.

Task C. Situation 3

Imagine you are on your way to your destination and wish to deviate up to twenty five miles right of track because of the weather ahead. A secondary option is five zero miles to the left of track. Make a request to the controller, then listen carefully to the controller's response and respond as necessary.

Part 3. Providing Information and Sharing Opinions

Task A. Work-Related Situation

Pilots sometimes provide air traffic controllers with reports about the weather conditions they encounter during a flight. Why are these reports important for the safe operation of aircraft?

Task B. Presenting an Idea about a Picture

Look at the picture provided. You have 15 seconds to study the picture.



Describe the picture in as much detail as possible. In your opinion, what phase of flight is the aircraft currently in? How can you tell? Give specific examples.
