### Part 1. Interview

### Part 2. Role-Play


Note: The test taker's callsign for all three sections is Hotel Lima five four six one. The interviewer should tell the test taker his/her callsign prior to starting.

#### *Task A. Situation 1*

Imagine you have just been transferred to the next controller and would like to step climb to flight level three five zero. The controller will be contacting you soon. Listen to the controller's message and make an appropriate response.

#### *Task B. Situation 2 (Picture)*

Look at the picture provided. You have 15 seconds to study the picture.



You are flying a heavy passenger jet on a five mile final for runway zero two right. Meanwhile a general aviation aircraft is on short final for runway zero two right. Listen to the controller's message then make an appropriate response, or request.

#### *Task C. Situation 3*

Imagine you are the first departure out of this airport and need to fly north to your destination, Hong Kong. However, the departure controller is vectoring you to the south, for awhile. Inform the controller about the direction you are flying, then listen carefully to the controller's response and respond as necessary.

### Part 3. Providing Information and Sharing Opinions

#### *Task A. Work-Related Situation*

What would you do if shortly after taking off, the purser reported that one of the passengers is suffering from a severe heart attack and needs immediate medical attention? Explain in detail.

#### *Task B. Presenting an Idea about a Picture*

Look at the picture provided. You have 15 seconds to study the picture.



Describe the picture in as much detail as possible. In your opinion, what phase of flight is the aircraft currently in? How can you tell? Give specific examples.

#### *Task C. Stating an Opinion*

The demands for training relatively young pilots and those more experienced, are bound to be a bit different. Which of these two types do you identify with more? What are the characteristics of this group and what type of training is most needed by pilots in this group? Why?
