### Part 1. Interview

#### **Task A. Greetings & Introduction**

### Part 2. Role-Play

Note: The interviewer narrates the situation and plays the role of the pilot. The test taker is the controller and responds to the situation and/or message.

#### **Task A. Situation 1**

Imagine you are working as an approach controller. The air navigation specialist informs you that a maintenance check needs to be performed on the ILS and it must be turned off. As a result, landing aircraft have to use the VOR/DME approach on runway one six. Tango Bravo eight two zero seven will be calling you soon. Listen to the pilot's message, then respond as necessary.

#### **Task B Situation 2 (Picture)**

Look at the picture provided. You have 15 seconds to study the picture.



Your radar shows that Papa Victor niner six four zero is in conflict with a fast moving, southwest bound, unidentified aircraft about seven miles to his right. Warn the pilot about the aircraft as you respond to his message.

#### **Task C. Situation 3**

Imagine you are working as an approach controller. Foxtrot Oscar five seven niner one is maintaining a heading of one two zero and descending to six thousand feet. Instruct the pilot to turn four zero degrees to the right for an ILS approach to runway one seven, then listen carefully to the pilot's response and respond as necessary.


### Part 3. Providing Information and Sharing Opinions
