Part 1. Interview

Part 2. Role-Play

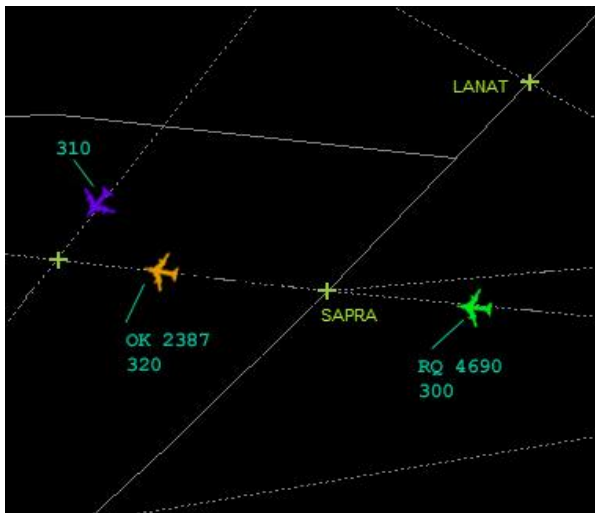
Note: The interviewer narrates the situation and plays the role of the pilot. The test taker is the controller and responds to the situation and/or message.

Task A. Situation 1

Imagine you are working as an area controller. The ATIS service at the airport is currently out of service. Arriving and departing aircraft can get ATIS information from another controller on one two eight decimal four. Juliet Yankee eight four seven eight will be contacting you. Listen to the pilot's message then, respond as necessary.

Task B Situation 2 (Picture)

Look at the picture provided. You have 15 seconds to study the picture.



Your radar shows that Oscar Kilo two three eight seven is in conflict with a fast moving, southwest bound, unidentified aircraft about four miles to his right. Warn the pilot about the aircraft as you respond to his message.

Task C. Situation 3

Due to traffic, you want the pilot of Victor Papa four one four eight to stop climbing at flight level three zero zero. Inform the pilot of this fact, then listen to the pilot's message and make an appropriate response.

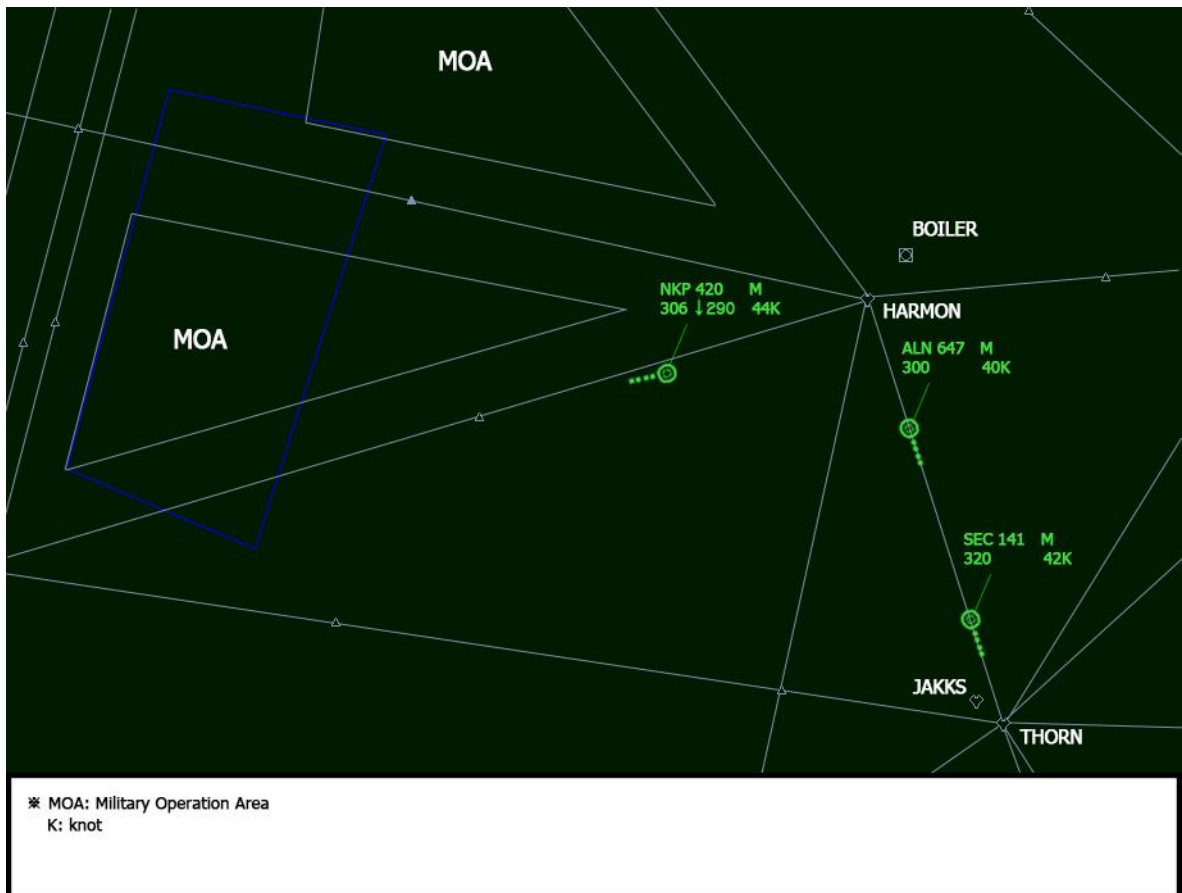
Part 3. Providing Information and Sharing Opinions
