#### Part 1. Interview

## Part 2. Role-Play


Note: The interviewer narrates the situation and plays the role of the pilot. The test taker is the controller and responds to the situation and/or message.

#### Task A. Situation 1

Mike Uniform two one one six, is being transferred to you and will be contacting you soon. Listen to the pilot's message, then give him instructions to change his altitude to flight level three five zero to avoid the turbulence.

#### Task B Situation 2 (Picture)

Look at the picture provided. You have 15 seconds to study the picture.



Your radar shows that Papa Foxtrot one niner niner eight is in conflict with a fast moving, unidentified aircraft, about eight miles to his left. Warn the pilot about the aircraft as you respond to his message.

#### Task C. Situation 3

Imagine you are working as an area controller. Lima Hotel one six four two is headed to Taipei, maintaining flight level three six zero and has requested a deviation ten miles to the right due to weather. Approve the pilot's request, then listen carefully to the pilot's response and respond as necessary.
